Youth Connection

One of the best parts about running a youth program is seeing the growth and change in youth over time. This year I saw one of the fastest turnarounds I have seen in a youth with Sally. The first 3 weeks she came to Youth Connection she was quite the handful! She would deliberately pick fights with kids, call them terrible names, and threaten to hurt them. She also did not take correction well and would make excuses and get mouthy when confronted by an adult. Oh the peace we would enjoy when Sally couldn't come!

One week things came to a head and after Youth Connection I texted to all the volunteers to please spend some time praying for Sally. When she came back I was planning to talk to her and clearly lay out expectations and consequences to her and see which path she chose. Two weeks later she was back and a little different. Yes there was all the drama but instead of anger and defiance there were tears and brokenness. One of our volunteers spent most of the day with her in a quiet place encouraging her, showing her love, and letting her know there was a better path she could choose. Every week after that there was a little less drama and little more delight.

Today you can hardly recognize the same girl. Every once in a while we see a glimpse of the old Sally but usually what we see is a 5th grade girl who loves to be with us, who is much more friendly, who works to do her part to get along with others and who puts in effort to have a good attitude.

She even wrote an advertisement for Youth Connection a few weeks ago "Some kids sit at home alone and bored. George the Monkey [our mascot] says, 'Come to Youth Connection and have fun!"

Sally is a constant reminder to me that prayer, patience, and loving connection are life changing.

Nearly 70 people spilled out of our Tuscany eating space into the coffee coup. A microphone battled miserably trying to capture each word so none would miss all the amazing affirmation being shared that Sunday afternoon. They had gathered in Gonvick at the Clear Waters Life Center to celebrate Casey's accomplishment. He had just completed the Mustard Seed Homes one year program. Family came from Moorhead and Ada. Counselors, case workers, pastors and friends from the surrounding communities all came to laud Casey and to help him see the incredible support system he had in place.

There are few things as encouraging as seeing a community come together for the sake of a few. MSH residents come from diverse backgrounds, communities, and heritage. They do often have a common

thread, brokenness. Broken relationships lead the list of things that men bring in with them when they walk through the door. Broken trust, broken commitments, broken vows and broken dreams. Sometimes it's a little overwhelming at the damage done. It reminds me of the nursery rhyme "Humpty Dumpty". This rhyme so tells the story of what the world has to offer, no hope for restoration. But we know the true King. And we know the promises of God, "with men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible!"

The most beautiful part of that Sunday afternoon, was when Casey's siblings shared. They all took

a turn, stood and confessed with tears streaming down their faces how they had been robbed of their brother. They gave glory to God for bringing back the one who was lost. They thanked us profusely for restoring their brother, their family and their hope. What a joy to see the family embrace each other and weeping tears of gladness. The King does restore! He does put things back together, different, but beautiful. All the King's horses, and all the King's men join together for the cause of a broken few. And by His Spirit He restores the brokenhearted.

My name is Bruce Emmel. I live on Clearwater Lake, with my wife, Audrey of 37 years. We have 2 adult children who are both married with a total of 6 grandchildren and 1 on the way. For the last 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ years, Audrey and I have welcomed into our home, Clara Albrecht who is like a daughter to us.

In Psalm 139:7-11, David wrote; "I can never escape from your Spirit! I can never get away from your presence! If I go up to heaven, you are there; if I go down to the grave, you are there. If I ride the wings of the morning, if I dwell by the farthest oceans, even there your hand will guide me, and your strength will support me."

Having been raised locally in a Christian family and exposed to the gospel from my earliest days, I placed my faith in Christ at an early age. Closing in on 63 years of age, there are many mile markers in the rearview mirror. However, long story short, most of my life I didn't pursue a deep relationship with God, yet I

know God did guide me and His strength supported me.

Starting out in Gonvick, my family moved in the middle of my 8th grade to Clearbrook and I graduated in 1977. On graduation day, I remember thinking, "I hate this place and never want to come back". After leaving Clearbrook, I spent some time in Aviation, working short stints as an aircraft mechanic and crop dusting. I met my wife at Oak Hills Bible College when I had this dream of being a missionary pilot. Audrey and I did do some church planting work in Canada, but returned to Oak Hills when I started working for Mesaba/Northwest Airlines. We moved back to Clearbrook and for 16 years I was the airline station manager in Bemidji. This position introduced me to the corporate world, taught me much about working with people and more importantly God used that time in my life to transform me for what he had planned for me next.

In 2006 Audrey was working as a Personal Care Assistant. Her client encouraged me to start a home care company. We prayed about it and we dedicated it to the Lord. With the help of a lot of God-sent people and the grace of God, we started Home at Heart Care. Little did I know that God had plans to turn a small vision into a home care agency that has served thousands of elderly and disabled clients in Northwest Minnesota. Ironically God also had plans for our main office to be in the elementary portion of the old Clearbrook School. By that time however, God had changed my heart and I loved being there. God blessed Home at Heart to be like a city on a hill, as Christ talked about in Matthew 5:14-16, a company made to pursue God's praise and glory. But after 14 plus years, I sensed it was time for me to transition out of Home at Heart and leave it in the hands of younger people. At the time I had no idea what that future held for me, but I know that God guided me and his strength supported me. I needed that confidence in his guidance and strength, as the same week that I signed papers to retire, I felt a lump on my neck that would prove to be cancerous. Yet, God again showed up. To date I am doing well. Praise God!

Last month I was asked to join Clear Waters Life Center senior team part-time as an Operations Leader. Simply put, it is a position created to primarily assist the program and business managers in establishing operating plans and goals and working with them to achieve those goals. That said, having known the leadership of Clear Waters Life Center and admired them for many years, I'm not sure that I can bring anything to the table, in and of myself. But my confidence in God is great! He has taught me much about following his leading and leaning on his strength. I also know that he has and is equipping me for what lies ahead. I truly appreciate the Senior's team support as I learn the different operations of Clear Waters Life Center and I begin to work with you all. Clear Waters Life Center is also blessed to be that city on a hill for the praise and honor of God. I'm excited to be a part. Thank you!
